ABOUT FREIRE SCHOOLS

Freire Schools is committed to ensuring that every single student who walks through our doors can succeed and grow. We provide students in underserved communities a college-prep learning experience with a focus on individual freedom, critical thinking, and problem-solving in an environment that emphasizes the values of community, teamwork, and a commitment to peace. We are four distinct schools in two different cities, each guided by the same values of equity, diversity, love, and critical thinking.

Freire students are confident, dynamic, and collaborative individuals who are engaged in their communities and are excited to apply the skills and knowledge they acquire at Freire Schools to create new possibilities for our future. Of Freire Schools' 2,000 students, 94% are Black or Latinx, and almost all students qualify as economically disadvantaged.

Even during the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, our students kept their sights set on college – our 274 Class of 2020 graduates were accepted to 165 colleges and universities and earned over \$13.8M in college scholarships and aid. Ensuring equity in education is at the core of Freire Schools' work. We strive to provide the individually tailored resources, supports, and experiences that each individual student needs to achieve at the highest level. Our average student to faculty ratio is 16:1.

OUR SCHOOLS

FREIRE HIGH SCHOOL

One of the first charter schools to open in Pennsylvania, Freire High School was founded in 1999 as the flagship Freire Schools campus. Our remarkable 18:1 student to faculty ratio allows us to provide the focused attention each student needs to catch up then surpass expectations. And people have noticed.

We have made U.S. News and World Report's "100 Best High Schools" list, and Metro has called us a top-five Philly charter school. Year after year Freire students beat local, state, and national averages in their college persistence rates. In each graduating class, typically 89% to 92% of all of our first-year college freshmen return to college for their sophomore year. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, our 81% second year persistence rate far exceeds the national average of 69%.

FREIRE MIDDLE SCHOOL

Our students arrive at Freire Middle School at a range of achievement levels. Here, they don't just catch up – they make leaps in personal and academic growth, setting them up for even greater success in high school. This past year, Freire Middle School received Great Philly Schools' 2020 High Growth Rating for demonstrating "impressive academic growth" over a three-year period in math and reading. In 2018-19 (the last year for which there are test results due to COVID-19), Freire Middle School ranked #4 out of all public Philadelphia middle schools on the School District of Philadelphia's annual School Progress Report. For the third consecutive year, Freire Middle School received a Progress score of 100%.

FREIRE WILMINGTON

Freire Wilmington's goal for our students is "Graduation x2" – success in and graduation from not just high school, but college as well. Our unique five-year high school program, starting in 8th grade, gives students the time and support they need to catch up and then excel. And it's working! Our proven college-preparatory academic program offers Delaware students a much-needed tuition-free, high-quality education option, and our 91% college acceptance rate far exceeds both the national average (69%) as well as Delaware's state average (61%).

TECH FREIRE

TECH Freire reimagines the college prep high school by blending state-of-the-art equipment and hands-on learning with the rigor of the time-tested Freire Schools liberal arts program to help each of our students truly thrive. TECH Freire enrolls students from throughout Philadelphia, with a focus on students who live in the nearby Strawberry Mansion area. We work every day to be a true community school – an integrated and contributing part of the neighborhood.

TECH Freire's Class of 2020 was accepted to at least 77 colleges and universities and earned over \$3.7 million in college scholarships and aid. Additionally, 59% of our first graduating class (Class of 2019 and latest data available) matriculated to college the following fall, exceeding the School District of Philadelphia's rate.
